Sub: Jurisdiction of investigation of complaints by Vigilance Unit and administration in CPWD.

Section 3.6(iii) of the Vigilance Manual (Volume-I) envisages that a complaint is to be passed on to the concerned administrative authority for appropriate action on the ground that no vigilance angle is involved. Further, Section 1.6.2 of the Vigilance Manual (Volume-I) envisages that in cases involving willful negligence, violations of systems and procedures, etc., the disciplinary authority will decide, in consultation with the CVO, whether a vigilance investigation is to be initiated or not. If not, it will be passed on to the administration for investigation.

In order to ensure efficient and effective handling of the cases which do not involve a vigilance angle, it is decided as follows:

- A complaint having administrative or technical overtones, and having no vigilance angle, will be referred to the ADG(S&P) who will ensure its expeditious disposal in accordance with the provisions of relevant service rules.
- The issue as to whether a vigilance angle is there or not in a complaint shall be decided in consultation with the CVO, CPWD.
