## Terms and Conditions of Deputation of Central Public Works Department officers on Foreign Service

- The officer will have the option either to draw his grade pay in the Central P.W.D. from time to time plus deputation (duty) allowance or the pay in the scale of pay of the new post as may be fixed under normal rules as per Ministry of Finance of Finance (Department of Expenditure) No. F.1(II)-F.III-(B)/75 dated 7.11.75 as amended from time to time.
- Dearness allowance will be regulated at the raters admissible to the Central Government servants.
- House rent and city compensatory allowance will be regulated at the rate admissible to the employee of the foreign employer.
- Liability for leave salary in respect of disability leave granted on account of disability incurred in or through foreign service even though such disability manifests itself after the termination of foreign service will be borne by the foreign service employer.
- He would be entitled to travelling and daily allowance for journeys in connection with his duties on foreign service as admissible to him under the Rules framed by the Foreign Employer.
- 6. The contribution towards leave salary and pension for the period the officer remains on foreign service will be paid by the foreign employer according to the rates in force from time to time in accordance with the orders issued by the President under F.R. 116. If the foreign employer does not pay these contributions the Govt. officer himself shall pay such contributions. Pending intimation of the rates of foreign Service contributions by the Pay & Accounts Officer of the officer from where the officer proceeded on deputation, the Foreign employer shall pay leave salary and pension contribution, due in respect of the Government servant on foreign services annually within 15 days from the end of each financial year or at the end of foreign services, if the deputation on foreign service expires before the end of the financial year, under S.R. 307 as amended from time to time at the following rates:

Monthly Contribution for Leave Salary

: 11% of the pay drawn in foreign service

from time to time.

Monthly Contribution of Pension

: As detailed below :-

(Rates of monthly contribution expressed as percentage of the maximum monthly pay of the post in the officiating / substantive grade, as the case may be, held by the officer at the time of proceeding on foreign service).

The amounts of contributions are to be credited under the following heads of accounts.

- Pension contributions under the Head "066 Contributions Recoveries etc. -Subscription and contribution".
- ii) Leave salary contribution under the Receipt Head Corresponding to the service Head of account to which the pay of the officer is debitable or where there is no corresponding receipt Major Head, to the Head "066 Contribution Recoveries etc. - Subscription and Contribution".

The leave salary and pension and contributions should be paid promptly subject to adjustments and alternations in accordance with final rates, as may be necessary after intimation of final rates, by the Pay & Accounts Officer of the office from where the officer has proceeded on deputation. Final interest would be levied if payments are delayed.

- He will remain subject to leave rules applicable to the service of which he is member.
- He will be eligible to the Medical attendance and the treatment not inferior to that admissible to an officer of the corresponding status under the Central Govt. rules.
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- Joining time, joining time pay and travelling allowance on transfer to the foreign service and reversion there from shall be regulated under rules framed by Foreign employer and paid for by him.
- He will be entitled to leave travel concession as admissible to the Central Govt.
  cmployees of his status and expenditure on this account will be borne by the
  foreign employer.
- leave in or at the end of foreign service shall be borne by the foreign employer.
- He will not be allowed to join Pension scheme which may be in force in the Foreign Service.
- The foreign service will commence from the date he relinquishes the post under the Central P.W.D. and end on the day he resumes duty in the Central P.W.D.
- 14. The provision of Govt. accommodation, if any occupies by him at the time of proceeding on deputation would be subject to the conditions laid down in the Ministry of W&H and O.M. No. 12016(1)/68-Vol.II, dated 13.12.68, as may be amended from time to time.
- He will be subject to C.G.E.I.S. Recovery of contribution towards C.G.E.I.S. may be effected from the deputation and amount remitted to the Pay & Accounts Officer concerned.
- 16. Contribution for leave salary or pension due in respect of a Government servant on foreign service. may be paid annually within fifteen days from the end of each financial year or at the end of the Foreign service, if the deputation on foreign service expires before the end of a financial year, and if the payment is not made within the said period, interest must be paid to the Government on the unpaid contribution unless it is specifically remitted by the President, at the rate of two paise per day month(Per) 100 from the date of expiry of the period aforesaid up to the date on which the contribution is finally paid. The interest shall be paid by the Govt. servant or the foreign employer according as the contribution is paid by the former or the latter.
- 17. In addition to the above contributions, the officer shall be required to subscribe to the Provident Fund to which he was subscribing at the time of proceeding on deputation Foreign Service, in accordance with the rules of the such Fund. He shall also have to repay the balance towards any loan and advances, eg. House Building Advance, Scooter Motor Car Advance, etc., which may be outstanding against him at the time of proceeding on foreign service.

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
